## Objectives and Strategic Actions

- Develop informational materials (brochures, videos, online courses) to highlight the benefits of democratic methodologies in schools.
- 2. Empower Teachers as Change Agents

- Provide professional development opportunities through:
- Training programs on democratic education, student-led learning, and active citizenship.
- Collaborative forums for sharing best practices and experiences.
- 3. Foster Self-Education Among Educators
- Encourage continuous professional and personal development among teachers to enhance their understanding of democratic principles and practices.
- 4. Establish Connections with Broader Communities
- Develop partnerships with local communities, businesses, NGOs, and cultural institutions to enrich the educational experience.
- Involve external experts in school activities to provide diverse perspectives.
- 5. Strengthen Collaborative School Governance
- Implement school governance models that include student and teacher representatives in decision-making processes.
- Organize regular meetings and assemblies to ensure transparency and inclusivity.
- 6. Prioritize Self-Directed Learning
- Integrate self-directed learning as a cornerstone of the curriculum, allowing students to take responsibility for their educational journeys.

- 9. Adopt Adaptive and Student-Centered Pedagogies
- Focus on spontaneous and situational learning rather than rigid, pre-determined study plans.
- Emphasize learning processes over standardized outcomes.
- 10. Cultivate Inclusive and Mixed Learning Groups
- Promote inclusive practices that encourage empathy and collaboration in diverse and mixed-age groups.
- Facilitate group activities that build social and emotional intelligence.
- 11. Implement Comprehensive Evaluation Systems
- Develop evaluation systems that include self-assessment for students and teachers.
- Use reflective practices to identify strengths and areas for improvement.
- 12. Engage with Parents and Families
- Create platforms for parents to actively participate in the school community.
- Offer workshops and discussion forums to educate families about democratic school principles.

#### Implementation Timeline

- Year 1: Conduct awareness campaigns and preliminary teacher training.
- Year 2: Pilot democratic methodologies in selected schools and refine strategies based on feedback.
- Year 3: Expand implementation to a broader network of schools and establish evaluation frameworks.
- Year 4: Review and adapt methodologies, ensuring sustainability and scalability.
